## About Us

The INPI regards it as a fundamental principle that, in order to acquire and maintain the highest possible standard of philatelic and antic coins knowledge, an expert must necessarily limit his activities to a particular field of expertise ("areas of specialisation") in which he is highly specialised and thus best qualified.

Each member's areas of specialisation shall be stated in the official list of members. If deemed necessary, the Board may reduce or otherwise limit a member's areas of specialisation.

Should a member subsequently wish to extend his areas of specialisation, he shall notify the President accordingly. The Board shall then decide whether the application for extension should be submitted for approval by the General Meeting. The General Meeting decides on such extensions of a member's areas of specialisation with a two-thirds majority of votes by the members present or represented.

The foremost aim of the INPI. is to unite the leading philatelic experts of all nations. The Association promotes and encourages the worldwide co-operation and the exchange of opinions between experts. It informs its members about the latest technologies in the production of forgeries and in the detection of forgeries and repairs.

The Association co-operates with similarly engaged national and international organisations in the fight against forgeries. It encourages and supports publications of studies dealing with expertising and/or forgeries.

Last but not least, the INPI tries to impress on collectors and dealers the role of expert opinions for the benefit and protection of philately and numismatic.

the members of the A.I.E.P. comprise the following types of experts:

Professional philatelic and numismatic experts who regularly issue large numbers of certificates;

Expert philatelists and numismatic who issue certificates;

Expert dealers and/or auctioneers who issue certificates;

Individual members of expert committees whereby the committee issues collective opinions, but the individual committee members do not issue certificates;

Experts who do not issue certificates but who are active as regular or occasional consultants to philatelists and numismatic, other experts, organisations or expert committees;


Expert Committees.

Each member of the INPI. has the same rights and duties.

In order to become a Member of the INPI., a philatelist or numismatic must have actually worked as an expert for a minimum of five years. He must be highly specialised in a given area, for which he is obviously expected to have adequate reference material.


Excellent specialist knowledge and absolute moral integrity are considered as fundamental prerogatives for becoming a Member of the INPI.
